2024 Augustana District Annual Report for Congregations

Dear Friends in Christ:

As 2024 comes to a close I've been hyper aware of all the transition stories we find in Scripture. Consider the stories of Abraham who is called to leave his homeland on an unknown journey, Joseph who is thrust into positions of leadership in Egypt after arriving there as a slave, Moses who shepherds God's people through the wilderness for 40 years, and the people of Judah who are led into exile in Babylon only to return 70 years later. These accounts are but a tip of the iceberg when it comes to characters of the Bible that find themselves in flux.

We have also found ourselves in a season of transition and flux here in the Augustana District throughout 2024. When the announcement came that Pastor Randy Freund was leaving the role of Service Coordinator, it was uncertain what the future would hold. Randy's absence leaves a hole in our district that cannot ever totally be filled, and we owe him a debt of gratitude for all the growth and stability he brought to us during his tenure. Not only do I want to thank Randy, but I also want to thank the Augustana District Council and the transition team that worked diligently to chart a path forward. Ultimately, the decision from these district leaders was to take the Service Coordinator position and divide it into 3 roles: the District Coordinator, the Theology Coordinator, and the Mission & Stewardship Coordinator. Why adopt this model? There are two reasons. First, to ensure that our core values of "church, theology, and mission" are well cared for. Second, rather than taking a full-time pastor out of the parish to fill Randy's shoes (which would only further add to the clergy shortage) this model allows pastors to stay in their pulpits while also serving the needs of the district. I was hired as the District Coordinator in September, followed by Rev. Dr. Marney Fritts as the Theology Coordinator and Rev. Nate Hanson as the Mission & Stewardship Coordinator in December.

As Marney, Nate and I meet, I only become more and more excited about the days that lie ahead for the Augustana District. The coordinator team is already dreaming up new ways we can support and nurture our district's congregations and pastors. After all, this is what districts are designed to do: encourage and surround you, the local body of Christ, and be a resource for any number of joys and concerns that arise in your faith community. I am available for consultation with congregational leadership and pastors on conflict response, church council retreats, and call committee coaching. Marney is available for questions on keeping good theology at the forefront everything you do in your church and is also working in tandem with the Board of Theology and Ministry to ensure we continue to have a strong pastoral endorsement process. Nate is passionate about domestic and international missions and will help you become connected with a ministry you can support, while also engaging with the Board of World Missions on how we can help fulfill the Great Commission globally.

All of this is to say, our God has been and continues to be faithful to the Augustana District as he was for Abraham, Joseph and Moses. God continues to match us step for step as we walk into this new season. The Creator of the universe, who hung the stars in place, and has numbered the hairs on your head, is a promise keeper, and his promise is to never abandon or leave his people. As new congregations join the district, and as you encounter new challenges and opportunities in your own congregations, Marney, Nate and I, along with the rest of the district staff, stand ready to answer the phone and be there for you.

In closing, I want to acknowledge Augustana District Office Administrator Wendy Magruder, Financial Coordinator Niki Pokornowski, Program Coordinator Rev. Becky Hand, and Webmaster Karen Eckstrom. Further, I am grateful for Todd Johnson, the Augustana District Council Chair, who has been an excellent leader during this time of transition. With a group of exceptional, dedicated individuals like this, an enthusiastic coordinator team, and the cross of Jesus Christ standing at the center, we are well equipped for whatever is coming in 2025.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Given February 9, 2025 summarizing January 1-December 31, 2024

Beloved in Christ, grace to you and peace. Thank you for our shared ministry as we enter our 19th year together.

WORSHIP

This past year we averaged 28 people at the first service and 118 at the second for an average total worship attendance of 146. We continue to live stream on Facebook. Brian Wick deserves our special recognition for his musical leadership. Thanks to Jackie Goodmanson for preparing the projection for the contemporary service. The Council approved going to one service during the summer months this year with great success.

CHILDREN AND YOUTH

Thanks goes to our Sunday school superintendent, Patti Wyss for her fine leadership of the program and her army of volunteer teachers, especially Theresa Anderson who led the Sunday school Christmas program to the delight of us all. What a joy to have over 100 kids participate in Community Vacation Bible School this year, hosted by United Covenant Church. We are always looking for volunteer Sunday school teachers so please consider serving.

This year our high school youth will journey to Kenosha, Wisconsin for a week of service and outreach. We continue to offer meals on Wednesday nights and the youth room is open and supervised by parents from 5:30-8:30 PM. Youth group has been meeting once a month for activities with family events sprinkled into the mix of programming. Special thanks to our parents who cook for the youth on Wednesdays. We will be considering additional youth and family programming on Wednesdays with the help of a committee of interested folks.

MISSIONS

All of our mission commitments were met again this year. We celebrate the many quilts made and donated by our quilting group along with over 100 school kits sent around the world through Lutheran World Relief. Many local children were blessed by our annual Christmas toy drive in cooperation with the Methodist Church. Our Easter Egg Hunt Outreach was another great success along with our Red Cross Blood Drives. The Women's Event in February has become very well attended. All new movers to our area received a welcome postcard from the congregation. Don't forget to take a prayer shawl to those in need of extra support and thanks so much to those who make the shawls.

MEMBERSHIP

Currently our total membership is 587. We updated our membership list this year and we intend to complete our online photo directory. There is hope to transition into more electronic communication. Help us get your latest contact information updated with the church office. We grieve the loss of four members this past year: Gail Clark, Dixie Croes, Steven Marg and Richard Sullwold. Remember their families in your prayers and acts of love. Our greeter corps is now welcoming all who come for Sunday services. Consider how you might do your part to graciously welcome and receive visitors at worship.

FINANCES

Thanks to our membership we have a financially stable congregation during trying times. That is no small accomplishment! Meeting all general fund expenses as well as a significant mortgage is a challenge. Remember the office has established an online giving portal on our church website as well as a QR giving code on Sunday bulletins. The proposed 2025 budget seeks to hold the line on expenses with a modest increase over last year. We had to rely on fundraisers to meet the shortfall to the General Fund but all bills and benevolences were paid.

Join me in prayer and hope as we strive to build up the body of Christ here at First Lutheran. Let's shine brightly for Christ as we seek to know Christ and make him known. As our mission statement says, "Growing God's Family by Serving".

COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It was an honor and blessing to have served on your Church Council as President in 2024. The Church Council's twelve members along with Pastor Bryan provide leadership to handle congregational needs throughout the year. The leadership and spiritual guidance of our Council addressing the needs of the congregation is inspirational. Ten of the twelve Council members will be returning to their roles in 2025, so there will continue to be a strong leadership team.

First Lutheran has been richly blessed in so many ways again this year. One such blessing was decreasing the balance on our Bremer mortgage loan, but we still have a substantial balance due. We finished the year with a budget in the black and should take actions to bring that balance down more quickly.

We continue to expand our **outreach** programs in the community through activities like supporting the community's Vacation Bible School, supporting Lifeline Food Pantry and ministering to the Clear Lake community by hosting the annual women's event, the Easter egg hunt, the Red Cross blood drives, the Heritage Days worship service in the event tent, and other various ways.

Our **youth** play an active role in our church and in the community. They serve meals, assist with the Fall Dinner, attend Christian concerts, conferences and events and enjoy recreational outings together. The annual Mission Trip provides an opportunity for any increasing number of youth to be the hands and feet of Jesus doing service in a community outside of their comfort zone; last year in St. Louis and next summer in Kenosha. We need more opportunities on Wednesday nights for youth Bible study and opportunities for them to discuss topics that they pick out. Additional youth leaders are desperately needed so we can add programming to our Wednesday evening schedule.

The two **worship** services we offer each Sunday morning give our members a choice in worship style and time; one with more contemporary Christian music at 8:30, and the other with a traditional service with hymns. It is my hope that the fellowship time between these two services will grow and bridge the two worship services. You are welcome to come early for the second service and share fellowship with someone who worshipped at the first service. It's important to keep our congregation united as one body of believers. To that end we held our 'Summer of Unity' and offered only one worship service during the summer until Rally Sunday.

Thank you for allowing me to serve the congregation as president in 2024. It has been a growing experience for me. Thanks for taking the opportunity to be actively involved in your church and its ministry. Share the spirit with others and keep praying.

MEN'S BREAKFAST AND BIBLE STUDY

The Lutheran Men in Mission for Christ (LMMC) has been the men's ministry at First Lutheran Church for 34 years. The group provides fellowship and spiritual growth through Bible study. The group meets on the first and third Saturday mornings of each month and any man is welcome. The group averaged ten to twelve men in 2024. The morning starts with coffee and breakfast served at 6:30 by one of the men and then follows with Bible study usually lead by Pastor Bryan from 7:00 to 8:00. In 2024, we have been studying the Gospel of Matthew. We generally read and discuss only one chapter of the book on a Saturday morning session, so studies are thoughtful and deliberate with a lot of time for discussion.

No prior Bible study experience is needed to fit in with this group. Any man who wants Christian fellowship with other men and wants to explore his faith through Bible study should join us. No reservations are needed; come when you can and leave when you have to.

To support church mission projects, in 2016 we began selling shopping cards to some of our favorite local merchants. The shopping cards are available at church each Sunday and are used like a debit or gift card. The men's group purchases the cards at a discounted price from the merchants and sells them to you at face value. You receive the full purchase value when you shop with our cards, you support the local businesses by using the cards and you support our church missions when you purchase the cards. We sell cards to Nilssen's Market, Clear Lake True Value and Kwik Trip.

Our first mission project was the purchase of the church's defibrillator in the gathering space and our most recent one was buying the chain-link kennel for aluminum can donations. Among the ongoing missions of the LMMC is monthly financial support of the Child Evangelism Fellowship – St. Croix Valley Chapter (CEF), located in the Clear Lake Area Community Center, where Pastor Bryan serves as a board member; the weekly Wednesday evening meals for the confirmation students and youth group members; the annual youth Mission Trip; the apples for the Sunday School Christmas program; and the cost for church lawn fertilization and weed control. The number of projects supported by LMMC will continue to increase as more funds become available through our offerings on Saturday morning and the proceeds from shopping card sales.

EDUCATION AND YOUTH

SUNDAY SCHOOL

There are currently 41 children enrolled in our Sunday school program- ages 4 through grade 6. We continue to use "on-line" registration utilizing a "google form".

First Communion for fifth-grade students was held on Maundy Thursday, March 28. The following students received their First Communion: Hazel Cain, Bennett Colbeth, Hunter Munson and Jack Sullwold.

First Lutheran Church continues to utilize a rotational model for Sunday school. "The Good News Bible" was distributed to the 4 Sunday School students entering third grade and is used through confirmation. "The Beginners Bible" is given to and used by children when they exit the cradle roll and is used through second grade.

The 2023-2024 scope and sequence of curriculum lessons used (published by Augsburg Fortress) included: "Creation", "Baby Moses", "Ruth "Mary and Martha", "The Last Supper", and "Fruit of the Spirit. Sunday, January 28 was utilized as Bible Camp Promotion Sunday. Ten First Lutheran Students attended WAPO Bible Camp last summer. The Women of the Word supported their attendance with a \$200 campership for each student.

Rally Sunday was held on September 10 as we kicked off the Sunday school year. A "pedal pull" family fun event was held after the chicken barbecue that day.

Theresa Anderson directed the Sunday School Christmas Program with the help of Laura Case, Lily Anderson, Tiffany Wagner and Lisa Anderson. This gift of song and story, "Around the Manger" was presented at the 10:00 service on Sunday, December 15.

The rotational model requires the commitment and involvement of numerous members of our church family. As teachers, they bring their talents, experiences and gifts to share with our children. We thank them and ask the Holy Spirit to continue to stir their hearts to stay involved with this very important work of the church. Theresa Anderson and Stacia Hoefferle continue to write and perform puppet shows to introduce each rotation. We thank Brian Wick for helping with music during opening when possible. We also extend a special thank you to all who volunteer as teachers for their ongoing dedication to the Christian education of the children of First Lutheran.

CONFIRMATION

Eight 10th graders were confirmed on Sunday, October 27th: Devin Alvermann, Andrew Buhr, Seth Cain, Jerret Case, Brennon Colbeth, Miles Johnson, Ben LaBeree, and Natalie Petersen. Confirmation instruction is held on Wednesday evenings for 7th-9th graders. Tim Wyss and Theresa Anderson team teach the 7th grade class. They study the Gospel of John. Pastor Bryan is the instructor for the 8th and 9th graders. 8th graders are led through a Bible overview and the 9th grade works their way through the Small Catechism. Youth group and regular worship attendance are also encouraged. Each youth must turn in a minimum of 20 sermon notes a year and serve the congregation in some capacity. All Confirmands are also encouraged to attend a week of Bible Camp or a servant trip during the summers.

Our summer staff was exceptional - demonstrating flexibility, resilience, and taking on key leadership roles. They met every challenge with energy, grace, and servant hearts. Site Plans Strategic Initiative We continue to make progress on our Strategic Initiative, centering on comprehensive site plans. This important work will guide our decision-making process and help us prioritize deferred maintenance and program development. We're excited about several projects scheduled for this winter and spring that will have an immediate impact on the upcoming summer. These plans are designed to enhance and support transformative outdoor ministry experiences for everyone who comes to our camps.

Donor Engagement In 2024, partnership giving remained steady, while annual giving fell short of our intended goal. However, designated giving saw an increase, leading to an overall rise in contributions compared to 2023. We are currently in the leadership phase of the Room for More campaign to complete the dining hall/meeting space project at Camp Wapo. Soon, we will launch a congregational effort, reaching out to you - our partner churches. Joel Abenth, Director of Donor Engagement, will be working closely with congregations, individuals, and families who wish to support the camp in various ways. Retreats and Events in 2024 Our non-summer season has been filled with a variety of retreats. Additionally, we welcomed over 500 guests for our Memorial Day Pancake Extravaganza, celebrated the 22nd year of the Wapo Golf Tournament, and hosted over 1,200 guests and volunteers during Advent, including 8 performances of the 35th annual Christmas Dinner Theater, "A Stranger for Christmas."

Rhythms of Faith This summer we were thrilled to be selected as an exemplary ministry site participating in the Rhythms of Faith Project, a nationwide research initiative seeking to use the camp experience as a catalyst for family faith practices. This project is coordinated by Wheaton College's Center for Leadership Development (HoneyRock) and Sacred Playgrounds, and funded by Lilly Endowment Inc. The results from our part of the research and across all the camps that participated are so affirming of the work we do in outdoor ministry and how it impacts families, churches and communities. We'll continue to share those results throughout 2025.

2025 Theme Inspired by Romans 15:13, our 2025 theme is **Breathe.** *"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."*

Whether it is singing around the campfire, in community with others, or in moments of quiet reflection, the Holy Spirit is our constant companion, leading us, comforting us, and helping us grow in faith and courage.
